Support Haitian Hurricane Relief Efforts at Tomorrow's Ciclovía

– On Washington Avenue from 5 to 16 Streets –

WHO/WHAT: The City of Miami Beach will host their third Ciclovía tomorrow, October 9 by once again transforming the heart of Washington Avenue into a paved park for people of all ages to stroll, cycle, skateboard, rollerblade and enjoy Washington Avenue with a new perspective.

As one of the few community events across South Florida this weekend that was not cancelled due to the storm, the corridor will be activated with various types of entertainment, including free yoga, bike clinics, food trucks, pet adoptions, face painters, DJs, fitness classes & much more.

“We were blessed and fortunate not to be seriously impacted by the storm,” said Miami Beach City Manager Jimmy L. Morales. “Sadly, our brothers and sisters in Haiti endured severe destruction, devastation and loss of life. We need to pay our blessings forward and one way to start is by supporting some of the Haitian hurricane relief efforts.”

At tomorrow's Ciclovía, the South Florida Haitian Hurricane Relief Committee will staff a booth near police headquarters at 1100 Washington Avenue to collect monetary contributions. Checks can be made payable to Sant La Haitian Neighborhood Center, who is serving as the fiscal agent for the effort.
